Cats News

Despite rehoming some of the lucky cats, we still have 32 currently in care, plus the 10 farm cats which means that we feed 42 cats/kittens EVERYDAY !

We are hoping with the New Year ahead, we will begin rehoming again.

New cats come in, taking the places of those who have been lucky enough to find a new loving home, our new cats are :-

MINSTREL – a black and white long haired cat, approx. 1 year old, not neutered or chipped. **MINSTREL** had been waiting for a space to come in for some time, being fed by a kind member of the public in

When he came in he looked very neglected with his beautiful long coat dirty and tangled. Once neutered, chipped and vaccinated, he will be looking for his forever home. As he is a very shy cat, he will need a quiet, experienced home, where, given time and patience will blossom into a gorgeous cat.

ARCHIE – A knock came at my front door at 5.30pm, and when opened, it was a member of the public, holding a bundle of cream fur. He had been found in the road at the top of Close Lane, going round in circles (very ominous). ENTER ARCHIE! He is a 6 year old British Shorthaired cat, his coat was all matted, half his bodyweight and had an abscess on his little face. He was in a sorry state. As it could not be determined if he had had a blow to the head through an **RTA** he was kept in at the Vets, VETS4PETS for observation. Gradually the circling ceased, and at the end of the week he was released into our care. He is chipped, but was neutered. But now, however, he has been neutered, de-matted and had 8 teeth removed. He is slowly but surely putting on weight, and when he is fully vaccinated, will make someone a lovely pet. His story... he has gone from one

owner to another, with the *microchip NOT UPDATED*.

CHARLIE – is a handsome white and black DSH male kitten, aged approx. 5/6 months – not neutered or microchipped. He was found in Hassall Street, Chesterton and scanned by our friend Michelle, who is a SCAN ANGEL! She brought him in over the Christmas period and sadly remains unclaimed.

FREDDIE – This is a sad case. We were alerted to a tabby cat with a damaged paw in Fenton near New Year. We responded to find an established entire male tabby DSH, not chipped. His larger pad on his front leg was very swollen and sore and he was completely 'turned off'. As he came from Fenton, we called his **FREDDIE**. Our thanks must go to the kind lady who has been feeding him, trying to find him an owner, and for keeping him going. FREDDIE was taken to our Vets for attention straight away, and it does not look good for the paw. Without further investigation, it looks like it could be Squamous

Carcinoma, but since coming in to us the pad has improved. He has had long lasting pain relief, and is to be seen again in a week or so, when decisions will have to be made. FOLLOW FREDDIES STORY

LOLA – New Year began with a concerned resident in Kidsgrove, as her neighbour had moved and LEFT THE **CAT BEHIND!** telling her to find a home for it. According to numerous neighbours, the cat was always having kittens, multiple cats everywhere. The cat, a tabby/tortie, DSH, was very shy, hiding under bushes, but with the help of a kind neighbour (JODIE, thankyou), we set up a feeding program and one cold, dark night the trap was set and she was caught. We have called her LOLA. Sadly LOLA may be pregnant, so a scan is imminent. Once settled in her new pen, yes -AT LAST – showed her appreciation by allowing her to be stroked and is now enjoying all the attention. Attention she most certainly

had **NOT** been having in her home, if you could call it a home that is. The state the house was left in was beyond disgusting, with mouldy cat faeces left in rooms, need I say more....Only that it is a prosecutable offence to abandon a cat, and also not to have it microchipped.

What will happen to her ? I said LOLA was in a cat pen? Yes, at last, thanks to a dear friend GRANT of SANCTUARY S.O.S...we have a new cattery at fosterer LAURA's. We have met some 'teething' problems along the way, but thankyou LAURA for being so patient, now we have a beautiful cattery complete with an outside run.

This has only been possible through **YOU**... our amazing supporters who donate to us.

At the moment we 32 cats in care (and with the 10 cats farm cats), we feed 42 cats every day, without fail. Thankyou to the kind supporter who donated many outside cat houses, which filled with straw make a cosy bed for these farm cats. They are all looking very well and well covered, they have really thick winter coats, although they are all short coated.


Thankyou everyone who donated cat food to us, without your help, life would be very difficult.
