Cats News

Numbers do not decrease a great deal, with offers of homes becoming lower, even for kittens.

One wonderful piece of news is that two of last year's kitten's **RALPH** and **NORMAN**, have gone to a lovely home with a very appreciative young couple, who had a lovely quiet home to offer them, the garden was super for cats.

Sometimes we have to wait for a while until that right home is found, sometimes longer than we would like, but worth the wait!

When Nantwich Vets rang to see if we could help with 2 kittens, our hearts when out to them, as they both had broken legs, received from **RTA's**.

CHANCE, a lovely fluffy black and white boy, found in Barker St Crewe, had a severely broken back leg, which the Orthopaedic Surgeon, Alan Mayo, said had been done four weeks ago! So poor **CHANCE** had limped, in pain, for four weeks and no-one had thought to bring him to a vet, as he was a stray. Strangely, he was neutered, but not microchipped. Most cats are neutered and chipped at the same time, as this in itself was strange. He is a very loving cat, but no one has come forward to claim him.

The second kitten with a broken leg was **CLEO**, a black and white **D.S.H**. aged approx. 8 weeks, found with another deceased kitten, following an **R.T.A**. She was soaking wet and cold,

and had to be treated for hypothermia first, to revive her. Her leg injury was not as severe as **CHANCE'S**, his requiring his leg pinning and external fixatures attached to keeping it secured.

CHANCE went to fosterer Laura, and Tilly has had **CLEO**. Two weeks after taking in, both cats came down with cat flu, so back to the vets again.

We have had to **APPEAL FOR HELP** as the vet's bill was £3000, a great deal of money for a rescue to find.

When we were called out to a stray cat in Kidsgrove, we did not expect to find a pedigree oriental male cat, neither neutered nor chipped with help from Facebook, the owner was traced, who bred them. As his life at this time was rather troubled, he signed WILLIAM over to us to be rehomed. following vaccination, neutering and chipping. Here we have to thank fosterer **PATRICIA** for taking him in. A very handsome black and white boy, has turned out to be an affectionate cat with a lot to offer.

Will Hope become the loving son to Faith again?

This was the final line to the story of **FAITH**, and her kitten son **HOPE**, found, with a stone cold, wet kitten on a bathroom floor in Stoke on Trent.

When **FAITH** went in to be spayed, she came out not only smelling differently, but looking differently too, as she had a vest on to protect her operation wounds **HOPE** "lost the plot" not recognising his mother, and we thought that the chances of rehoming them together were slim, but once the offending vest was removed, he acknowledged his mother, and after a short time we rehomed together!

Our thoughts and thanks go to fosterer **DOREEN**, for her patience in getting these cats to eat-every cat food tried – before re-homing.

ALL'S WELL THAT END'S WELL.

Readers will be pleased to hear that tabby female stray **SASHA** produced 5 bonny kittens shortly after coming in. She has been a very protective mother, and her kittens hopefully should be ready to go by January.

Following a call out for "a kitten with a crisp packet on its head" in kidsgrove, turned out to be a young female, aged approx., 12 months. This cat had been out for a while, as her coat was full of debris and dirt, where she had sheltered in rubbish, her name is **CODY**, a black and white **D.S.H**. is so affectionate that you would feel that someone would claim her – but no. We are now left with the question of whether she is spayed or not? Time will tell.

A dead cat reported to us on Dennis Round Court, revealed a sad story of an 18-month-old black cat, seen to be run over at the entrance to Hall Drive, thankfully he was chipped, but when the owners were contacted, they had rehomed her from one end of the village to the other, 2 weeks ago. Here we must urge new cat owners to keep new cats in for at least 4 weeks to allow adjustment to new smells, environment and **YOU**.

Sadly, this cat was trying to get back to her original home and had paid the price on busy roads.

The weekend of the Bonfire at the **PLOUGH INN** resulted in call outs to a cat and a dog.

The cat, a ginger and white **D.S.H** male, not neutered or chipped, was desperately trying to get into someone's house on the Stables Estate. How do you re-unite a cat with its owner, if it hasn't any chip? Through the power of Facebook of course!

It appears he was an indoor cat, who had got out. **PLEASE NEUTER AND CHIP INDOOR CATS**, because there is always the chance they will escape. He is now reunited with his owner. The dog was a liver and white spaniel, who was chipped, but owner could not be contacted. Through the power of friends and Facebook, he was reunited with his owner.

On Sunday, 3rd November, we responded to a call from the **QUEENS HEAD** Kidsgrove, where they felt they had a pregnant cat about to give birth.

Quickly we rushed over, to find a very substantial male tabby cat, a very handsome cat in good condition although shy, we managed to scan him - and lo and behold – he had an owner. When we did manage to contact the owner, much to hers, and our surprise - he had been missing for 1 year!!! Sadly, he is so shy, he will need to be trapped, but an excellent attempt to win him over was made by Daniel, who has the making of a cat whisperer to be sure.
